



CPHA Style of Riding Jumper Equitation Class 2024 (Qualifying Class)

Eligibility:

- The CPHA Style of Riding Jumper Class is open to all Jr/Am riders who are current members of the CPHA, and whose trainers are current members of the CPHA.
- For the class to count, at least 3 riders must complete the course.
- Riders **MAY** continue to ride in this class to accumulate points for the CPHA Style of Riding Year End Award.
- This is a jumper seat equitation medal class scored as a Table II, 2b format jumper class.
- When there is an equality of jumping/time faults then the judge's subjective style of riding score will break the tie.
- A rider must have no jumping, or time, faults as well as a judge's score of 75 or better to compete in the jump off round.
- The time allowed must be monitored for the first three riders that complete the course successfully, and adjusted if the judge deems necessary.
- The first 3 riders may continue to the jump off if they have a score of 75 or above and no jumping faults, They may have up to 5 time faults to continue until the time has been announced as the final time allowed after the third rider or when the judge determines the time is acceptable for the course being ridden. If at that time they still have incurred time faults their score will only be reflected in round 1. The jump off score will not be counted.
- If early riders have time faults but no jumping faults, and a score over 75, they may proceed to the jump off while the time allowed is being monitored.

Class Conditions:

- This class is a jumper seat equitation class held in the jumper ring over a course of fences set at 1.00m in height with spreads to 1.15m, in a Table II, 2b format.
- The course must contain a triple or two double combinations and a **Liverpool**.
- The Liverpool may not be used in a combination.
- The course should be of the type used in a Children/Adult Jumper class.
- Time allowed will be calculated at 350 meters per minute.
- A jumper type horse and conventional jumper equipment will not be penalized.
- Standing and running martingales **ARE** permitted.
- Draw reins and German martingales are **NOT** permitted.

Judging:

- The class will be judged under a modified Table II, 2b format with jumping and time faults being calculated.
- The judge's equitation score will break the tie for the riders who have an equality of faults in their jumping score.
- At the completion of the first round all riders with CLEAR rounds (no jumping or time faults) **AND** a total score of 75 or better will immediately (after the tone) complete the jump off/work off shortened course.
- The jump off/work off is judged in the same manner as the first round, with an emphasis placed on an efficient time saving track. The judge's jump off score of the rider is **ADDED** to their first round score, and the rider with the highest cumulative score **and** the least faults is the winner.
- Two refusals will incur elimination.
- The open numerical scoring system will be used, and jumping faults and the judge's equitation score will be announced after each round. There is no need to deduct the time and jumping faults from the numerical score. The judge can do that on their card if they wish but it will not be announced. Just the jumping/time faults and the tie breaking judge's score will be announced.
- The remaining placings for the class (competitors not participating in the jump off), will be determined by the rider with the least number of faults and the highest judges score. (Basically scored as a jumper class, but the judges score, instead of the time will break the tie when there in an equality of faults)

Year End Awards and Championships:

- Points will be awarded in classes as follows: 6, 4, 3, 2, 1.
- Placings go to 5th.
- Three competitors must complete the course to receive points.
- The points go towards a year end high point award, which will be given at the annual CPHA year-end banquet.
- There will be two Style of Riding Championship classes held, one in the south and one in the north.
- To be eligible for the Championship an exhibitor must have ridden in at least one class prior to the championship of the current show year.
