

CPHA Style of Riding Jumper Equitation Class 2018 (Qualifying Class)

Eligibility: The CPHA Style of Riding Jumper Class is open to all Jr/Am riders who are current members of the CPHA, and whose trainers are current members of the CPHA. For the class to count, at least 3 riders must complete the course. Riders **MAY** continue to ride in this class to accumulate points for the CPHA Style of Riding Year End Award.

**Class Conditions:** 

- This class is a jumper seat equitation class held in the jumper ring over a course of fences set at 1.00m in height with spreads to 1.15m, in a Table II, 2b format.
- The course must contain a triple or two double combinations and a Liverpool.
- The Liverpool may not be used in a combination.
- The course should be of the type used in a Children/Adult Jumper class.
- Time allowed will be calculated at 350 meters per minute.
- A jumper type horse and conventional jumper equipment will not be penalized. Standing and running martingales ARE permitted.
- Draw reins and German martingales are NOT permitted.
- Any riders completing the first round without jumping and/or time faults and with a judge's score of **70** or better will also complete an immediate jump off/work off round.
- The jump off is judged in the same manner as the first round. The judge's jump off score of the rider is added to their first round score, and the rider with the highest cumulative score **and** the least faults is the winner.

Judging:

- The class will be judged under a modified Table II, 2b format with jumping and time faults being deducted from the rider's equitation score (4 points deducted for each rail down and 1 point deducted for each time fault).
- At the completion of the first round all riders with CLEAR rounds (no jumping or time faults) **AND** a total score of 70 or better will immediately complete the jump off/work off shortened course.
- The jump off/work off will be scored in the same manner as the first round, with an emphasis placed on an efficient time saving track. The judge's jump off score of the rider is added to their first round score, and the rider with the highest cumulative score **and** the least faults is the winner.
- The judges will evaluate the rider's ability as a show jumping rider, and the manner in which the course was ridden regarding technical merit, judgment, and

the execution of an efficient, time saving pace and track in meeting the specific challenges incorporated into the course by the course designer.

- The open numerical scoring system will be used, and the judge's score will be announced after each round.
- The remaining placings for the class (competitors not participating in the jump off), will be determined solely by the first round score (after deducting jumping and time faults), but regardless of clear rounds.

Year End Awards and Championships:

- Points will be awarded in classes as follows: 6, 4, 3, 2, 1. Placings go to 5<sup>th</sup>. Three competitors must compete and complete to receive points. The points go towards a year end high point award, which will be given at the annual CPHA year-end banquet.
- There will be two Style of Riding Championship classes held, one in the south and one in the north.
- To be eligible for the Championship an exhibitor must have ridden in at least one class prior to the championship of the current show year.
