No matter how experienced someone is, being at the top creates a different form of butterflies in your stomach, a feeling that's hard to explain. When I heard the test was to be completed with no stirrups, I immediately knew I wanted to push myself past my comfort zone and carry out the test to the best of my ability. I could feel Pedro was on the same page right when we stepped into the ring; we were ready to nail the test.

Pedro, who I am lucky enough to call my partner, is truly magical, hence why he is also called Peter Pan.
